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
# Older Worker Reports: Overview

- Older Workers: Defined as workers aged 55 and older.
- OWR Data is extracted from the Public Use QWIs.
- Reports spotlight a number of aspects relating to Older Workers and local/state economies.
- Comparable statistics across all partner states.

# Older Worker Reports: Changes

- Report is now *county* based.
- Also includes *metropolitan areas*.
- PDF document (print-ready).
- Maps show statewide variation of older worker distribution.
